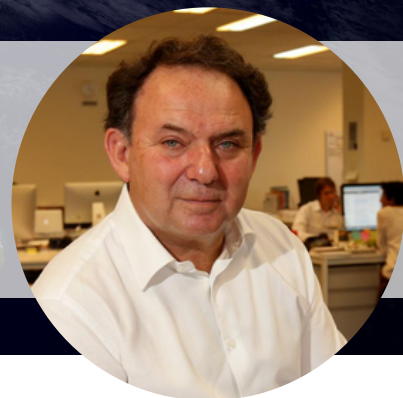

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FROM THE DIRECTOR



This is our first impact report since 360info's launch 18 months ago. It is a strategic initiative of Monash University and was enabled by the university's generous operational funding and in-kind support. We hope you will find our progress to date of interest and we'd welcome [your comments and feedback](#).

Here are some highlights since launch in November 2021:

- ▶ We have commissioned and published 746 articles, written by close to 1,000 researchers from 400 universities in 55 countries. (May 2023)
- ▶ In March 2023, 360info was independently audited by NewsGuard Trust Ratings and awarded its highest score: 100/100. The same as the Washington Post, New York Times and The Guardian.
- ▶ With support from Monash Malaysia, we were able to expand our team by hiring two editors in Kuala Lumpur and one editor in Jakarta. Together with our existing editor in Delhi and part-time assistance in both Osaka and Hong Kong, we are now able to deliver a comprehensive pan-Asia service.
- ▶ The University of Sydney and UNSW have become our first non-Monash partners in Australia, allowing two extra commissioning editors based in Sydney. These extra editors will add 30 percent commissioning capacity to 360info.
- ▶ India's Manav Rachna University and Jindal Global University have agreed to join 360info and each provide an editor in Delhi. We expect a number of other Indian universities to join following my 10-day trip to meet Indian universities and their VCs with Bharat Bhushan, our India Lead.
- ▶ Other editors are expected to follow with our discussions with the University of Nairobi's Africa Leadership Centre for a Nairobi/Africa editor.



What is the problem we are trying to fix?

Public media is in crisis around the world. As the global media landscape becomes increasingly homogeneous and tightly controlled by fewer players, the depth and diversity of information continues to diminish. This vacuum has presented an opportunity for those who wish to deliberately confuse by polluting the ecosystem with misinformation, PR, and low-grade information.

However, this 'crisis of information' also offers the world's leading universities a transformative opportunity. Universities are content-rich with research applied to addressing the challenges facing society and offering constructive and practical ways to address those. Yet most university research is unseen by the public and decision makers; often locked behind academic journal paywalls and written in inaccessible language, its impact is regularly unrealised or unrecognised.

Further, without visibility or understanding of that research, the public response has often been to call into question the value of universities.

To reposition universities as a trusted supplier of content and increase the real-world impact of their research, 360info operates as an open-access global information agency (like a 'Research Reuters' or AAP). We harness invaluable research from the world's universities, translate it into plain and understandable language and finally push/distribute that content to outlets across Australia and the Indo-Pacific region - the world's fastest growing and increasingly influential region.

The new service establishes Australia as the global headquarters for the distribution of topical, newsworthy applied research conducted by universities in more than 200 countries.

The outcome?

Since launch 18 months ago our content has a combined potential reach of 350 million readers and growing.



We still believe, however, that there is room to grow both our distribution and impact, and have this year put in place new strategies to boost usage.

Another key challenge we have discovered is that recording the total impact of 360info is difficult given all our content is distributed by third parties - and we can't access their data.

In April 2023 we secured funds from Meta/Walkleys to build a new tool that will help us address this issue, and better report our impact. Google Australia has also been providing critical pro bono advice on the build, and we expect to have the product ready by mid-2024.

Finally, on a personal note, I'd like to express my profound gratitude to Monash University's Vice-Chancellor, Professor Margaret Gardner; Professor Susan Elliott, The Provost; Trent Gillam, Chief of Staff to the Provost (now the VC); and Professor Marilyn Warren, the Chair of the 360info Advisory Council. Without their support there would be no 360info.

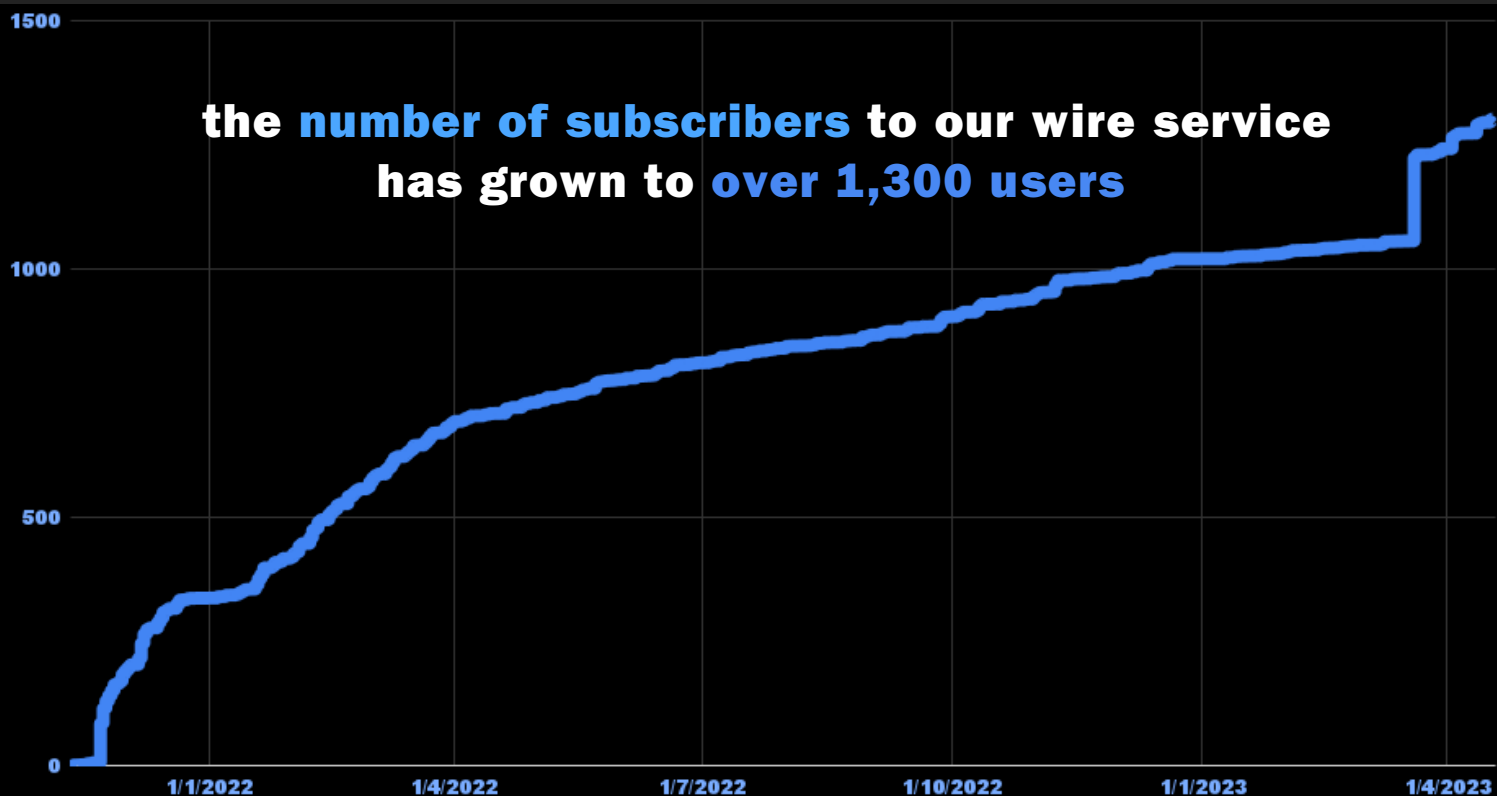

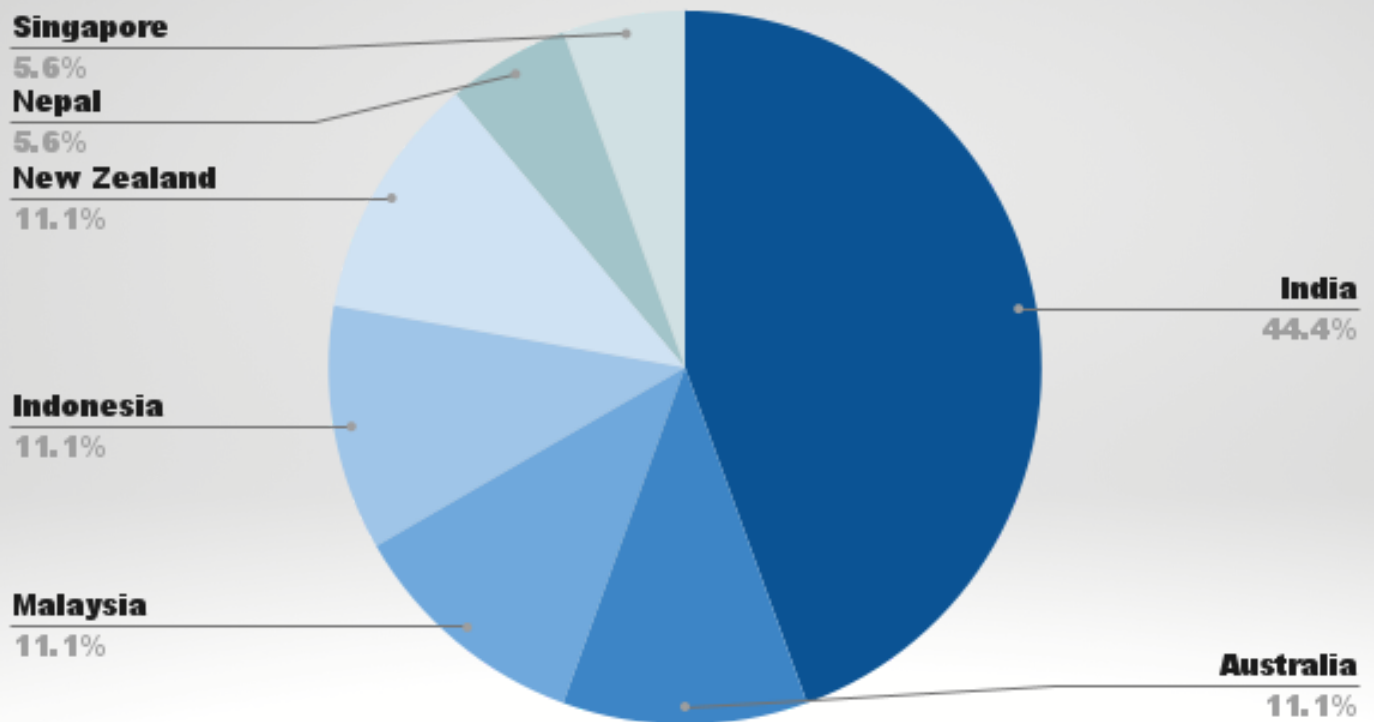

ASSISTING PUBLISHERS

A particular highlight has been our collaboration with local and regional news providers to deepen their editorial output and range of content.

Despite facing increasing financial pressures, local newspapers continue to play a significant role in many regional and rural communities throughout Australia, serving as a crucial source of information and connection for their local communities.

Strategy

In June, 360info partnered with the Australia-Pacific Broadcasting Union (ABU) Media Academy to produce a Special Report: Taming the wild west of misinformation.

In addition, 360info Editor-in-Chief Andrew Jaspan spearheaded and participated in a 'Taming Misinformation' webinar for ABU members, to highlight the extent of misinformation and provide media professionals with strategies for dealing with it.

NewsGuard RATING

360info's Charter, policies and working practices were carefully devised to ensure we deliver unbiased, explanatory and contextual information.

In recognition of our fastidious adherence to the highest editorial standards, US ratings agency NewsGuard has awarded 360info its highest possible trust rating - 100/100.

A team of experienced journalists and media professionals assessed 100 news sources around Australia using a rigorous, evidence-based approach, and assigned each a score out of 100 to indicate the level of trustworthiness of each site.

Only six other Australian outlets received a perfect score. Prominent organisations rated 100/100 by NewsGuard include The New York Times, The Washington Post and The Guardian.

This important achievement sends a valuable signal to our current and potential publishing partners, and demonstrates our commitment to fighting misinformation in the public sphere.

SPECIAL REPORTS

The initial launch product of 360info was the Special Report, consisting of a package of feature articles of between 400 and 1,200 words on SDG-aligned topics.

Each report contains multiple global perspectives from academics around the world, forming a key cornerstone of our efforts to correct the asymmetries in the current ‘global information order’ between global north and south.

To date we have produced 89 Special Reports, with an average article count of 8 articles per package.

Content is released each week onto our Newshub, and embargoed so outlets have time to build content into editorial planning. Our special reports usually include a framing article to outline some of the key facts and figures, and essential context on a timely issue.

Fukushima Wastewater



In April this year we released a Special Report covering Japan's controversial plan to release a million tonnes of treated radioactive wastewater from its Fukushima powerplant into the Pacific Ocean.

The package contained six diverse perspectives from academic authors, highlighting the breadth of global debate on this contentious issue.

Articles from the report were republished over 40 times, and we particularly widely redistributed in the Pacific region with partners including the Fiji Times, Cosmos Magazine, Radio New Zealand, Samoa News, the Pacific Island News Association and the Pacific Island Times.

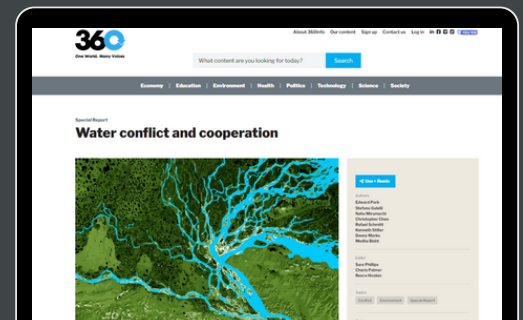
We have also worked closely with various groups to produce collaborative special reports on areas of their choosing.

Water Science Policy Collaboration

Water Science Policy (WSP) is a multilingual multimedia platform delivering insider water-related content from researchers to global audiences.

In September we had the opportunity to work with WSP on a project for the Mekong River. With a mix of interactive data, graphics, articles from academic researchers and photostories from journalists we communicated the challenges, opportunities, and beauty of one of Earth's most vital lifelines.

Our content was translated into five languages.

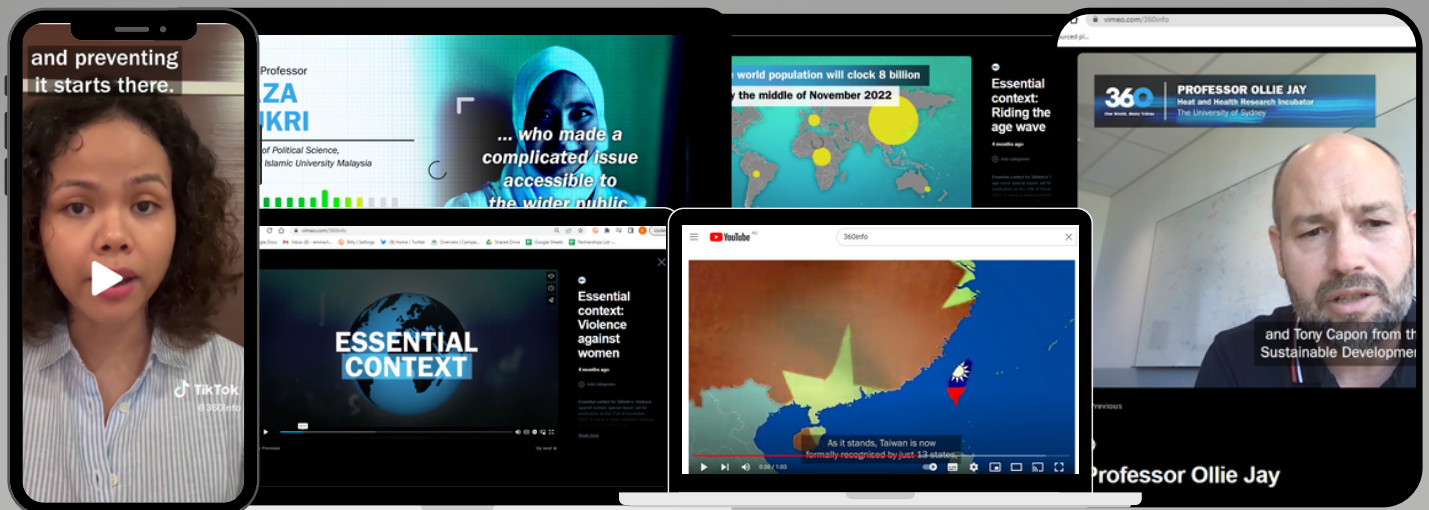


MULTIMEDIA

Video

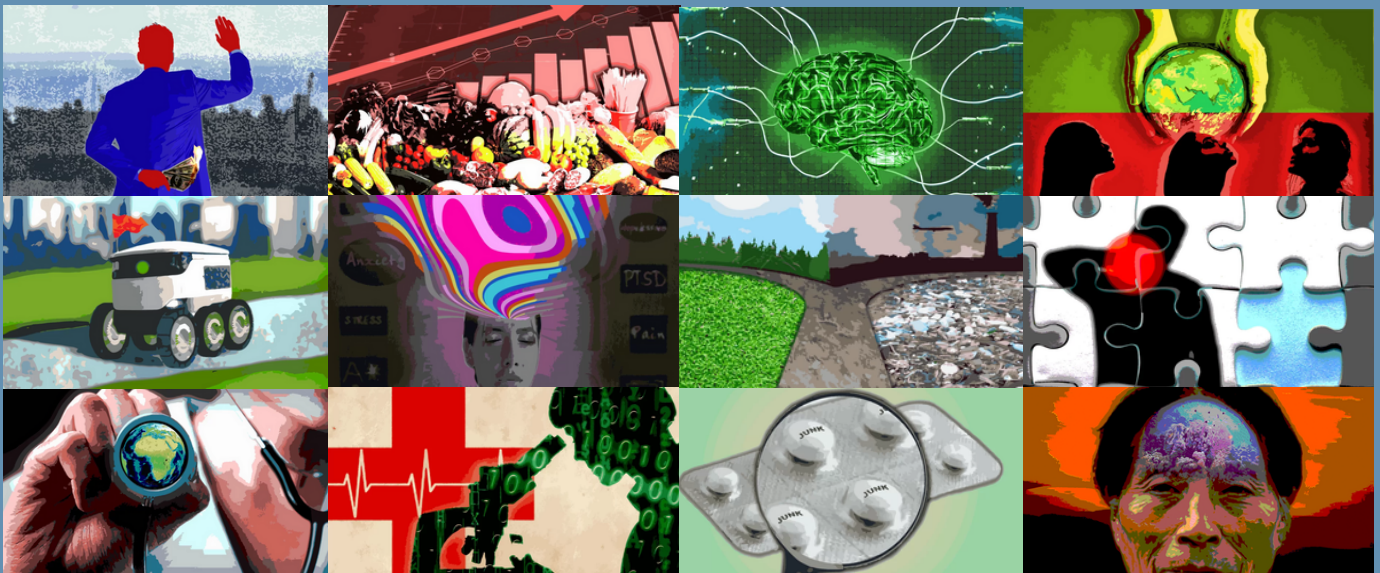
In January 2022 we added Essential Context videos to complement each Special Report. These provide a concise look at the key issues we're tackling each week, and can be used as an accessible teaching resource or handy visual snapshot.

We have also released video interviews with authors and author bio videos, and this year, as we expand and develop our video output to reach new audiences, we have started producing short form 'explainer' style videos for TikTok and Youtube shorts



Graphics

In addition, all graphics released alongside our content are made available under Creative Commons 4.0 licensing, allowing our publishing partners to reuse and distribute them.



DATA JOURNALISM

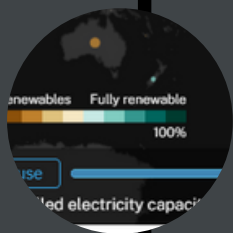
One of the best ways to make sense of the complex world we're living in is via graphics and data - something we at 360info are working to expand in the year ahead.

As a supplier of content to other people's websites, our aim is to provide valuable resources to time-pressured editors and reporters. That's why we've opened up access to all the assets behind our graphics, along with the Github of data behind our interactives and other code-based content. This includes versions of our graphics without the 360 logo, and components for users to remix and add to in the spirit of Creative Commons 4.0.

DATA INTERACTIVE: RENEWABLE ENERGY TRANSITION



In November last year we updated our map of the global transition to renewables, drawing on open data from the International Renewable Energy Agency in time for the global climate talks in Egypt.



The interactive map shows how much of each country's electricity has come from renewable sources each year since 2000—a reminder of how far we've come recently, and yet how much further we have to go.



The map was popular in US energy circles, with a front page "Chart of the Week" republication by Canary Media driving thousands of views, as well as leading several hundred additional views back to our main website.

It's also received regular weekly engagement from a Catalonian online course, highlighting the role our open visuals can play in educational settings.



DEEP CONTEXT

Based on feedback from our publisher partners looking for content related to current news events, we developed the Deep Context product, launched in May last year. These packages offer an in-depth view on a complex issue currently in the news, but go beyond the headlines. Each includes a short series of articles and a briefing note.

Putin and the ICC



In May last year we released a Deep Context package on Vladimir Putin and the likelihood of him appearing before the International Criminal Court.

Articles in the package were picked up for republication 27 times by outlets across the region including East Mojo, The Week and NewsDrum.

SOLUTIONS SUMMARIES

In an effort to better reflect our position within the increasingly significant Constructive Journalism sphere we have started producing 'Solutions Summaries' for release alongside certain packages. Written by 360info editors, these succinctly outline the key research-led solutions put forth by our academic authors.



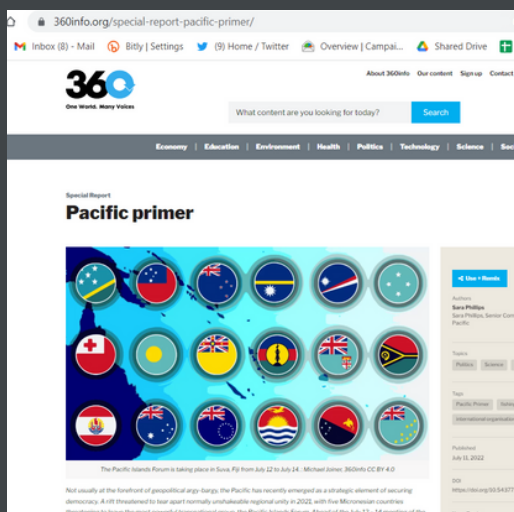
EVENT PRIMERS

Our Event Primers are special packages released ahead of significant global events, designed to give our media partners a research-led toolkit to better understand the essential context and significant issues at stake.

Pacific Primer

360info's Pacific Primer special report, released ahead of the 51st Pacific Islands Forum in July last year provided our media partners with expert analysis, news features and multimedia content in advance of the meeting. Our editors worked closely with the Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat, honing in on the key issues to be discussed at the Forum.

Feature articles from the report received over 80 republications with a potential reach of 41 million readers.

COP27 Primer

360info's COP27 Primer special report provided our media partners with expert analysis, a journalist's toolkit and multimedia content ahead of the 27th annual UN meeting on climate.

Feature articles from the report received over 100 republications with a potential reach of just under 30 million readers.
